Amazing Race Weekend

6. A unique joint training weekend with the Carleton Place and Kemptville cadet corps will take place 17-18 Nov at Connaught Ranges and the local area. This will be an overnight activity, beginning Saturday morning at 0930 and concluding on Sunday at 1400. Meals, accommodations and special evening activities are provided. Partial participation may be possible, but advance notice will be required.

Cadet Fitness Assessment

7. The 20 Nov sports night will include the Cadet Fitness Assessment (push-ups, sit-ups, sit and reach, shoulder flexibility test and shuttle run). All cadets are required to participate in this once a year to complete their phase training. Certain deployments and summer courses require a successful assessment.

Requesting Leave and Absences

- 8. Leave is only authorized once requested through a request form available on the <u>website</u>, or in the Ship's Office. Cadets who do not request leave will be considered absent without authority (AWOL). Attendance is used to determine eligibility for special events including summer camps.
- 9. Cadets who require more than 3 weeks of consecutive leave must request to be excused drill and training. This is done through a cadet's divisional officer, and a substantial reason must be provided.
- 10. Cadets who fail to request leave for four (4) consecutive weeks are considered non-effective and will be released from the cadet program.

Wearing the Cadet Uniform

- 11. Cadets are only authorized to wear their uniforms at cadet events and travelling directly to and from those events.
- 12. Cadets who wish to wear their uniforms to other events (Remembrance services at school, funerals, weddings etc...) must submit a request form to their Divisional Officer. Cadets may wear their uniforms to these events after permission has been given by the Commanding Officer.
